A few facts...

From Ukraine to Aarhus, Denmark

- *1176 refugees with a valid residence permit allocated to Aarhus Kommune*
- *62 refugees in Aarhus are currently awaiting residence permit*
- *514 housing facilities currently available (approx. 1480 persons)*
- *71 refugees in permanent jobs*
- *735 refugees are part of the employment effort in Aarhus*



Supply and demand

Employment status as of June 10 2022	No.
Ordinary job placements	71
Contract pending residence permit	0
Declined joboffers	3
Internships etc.	6
Concrete recruitment requests	32
Companies with an interest in hiring refugees from Ukraine	91
Refugees part of employment effort*	735

**refugees allocated to company consultants or otherwise engaged in internships, language courses etc.*
